Japanese Language Education in Michigan

K-12 Schools that Offer Japanese Language Courses (Spring semester, 2012)

- 51 schools in Michigan offer Japanese language courses at the K-12 level.
- 3,743 students are enrolled in Japanese language courses at the K-12 level.
 - 34 high schools offer Japanese language courses with a total of 1,899 high school students enrolled in Japanese in Michigan.
 - 17 elementary and middle schools offer Japanese language courses with a total of 1,819 elementary and middle school students enrolled in Japanese in Michigan.

4-year College and University Undergraduate Japanese Language Programs (Fall semester, 2011)

- 16 colleges and universities offer Japanese language programs.
- 7 schools offer majors in Japanese language.
- 12 schools offer minors in Japanese language, 7 of which also offer majors in Japanese language.
- 2,152 students are enrolled in Japanese language courses.
- 310 students are currently majoring in Japanese language.
- 328 students currently have minors in Japanese language.
- 137 Japanese courses are being taught in Fall, 2011. Students majoring in a great variety of different subjects study Japanese. Popular subjects include: Asian Studies, Engineering, Business, Foreign Languages, International Studies, Linguistics, English and Psychology.

Post-Graduate Japan-Related Programs (Fall semester, 2011)

- 2 schools offer post-graduate studies in Japan-related programs.
- Approximately 85 students are enrolled in post-graduate Japan-related programs. Japan-related programs are not limited to Japanese language study, but to any type of Japan-related studies.

Community College Japanese Courses (Fall semester, 2011)

- Some community colleges, including Lansing Community College and Oakland Community College, offer Japanese language courses.
- 224 community college students are enrolled in Japanese language courses.
