## <u>Japanese Language Programs Remain Strong in Michigan: Thousands of K-12 and College</u> <u>Students Enrolled in Japanese Language Courses in the State</u>

The Consulate General of Japan in Detroit recently completed its annual survey of Japanese language education in the state of Michigan. This survey lists the number of K-12 schools, universities and colleges offering Japanese language programs in the state, as well as the number of students enrolled.

In Michigan, there are 32 high schools and 14 elementary and middle schools that offer Japanese language courses with a total of 3,031 students in the state enrolled at the K-12 level. In addition, there are 17 colleges and universities offering Japanese language programs with 1,793 students enrolled.
