"Operation 2000" Plants Cherry Trees in

Dayton Area on 3.11 Anniversary

On March 11, the 10th anniversary of Great East Japan Earthquake, the Operation 2000 Cherry Tree Project planted cherry trees in three locations in the Dayton, OH, area. Consul General Nakagawa participated in ceremonies and cherry tree plantings at Carillon Historical Park (pictured below left), the Dayton Art Institute (below center), and the Fairborn Government Center (below right) near Wright-Patterson Air Force Base.

In the wake of the earthquake/tsunami disaster in March 2011, Dayton resident, Alex Hara, felt gratitude for the national and local response by those around him to assist Japan with recovery efforts. Mr. Hara founded an organization to plant cherry trees across Ohio and the Miami Valley, as a symbol of the special friendship between the U.S. and Japan. The original goal of 1,000 trees was met, and later expanded, so the organization is now known as the Operation 2000 Cherry Tree Project.

On March 6, four teams from upper-level high school Japanese classes competed online in the 2021 Ohio Japan Bowl, a quiz-bowl type competition about Japanese language and culture.
