
Culture Increasingly Available Online

Resources for Learning about Japanese

The Consulate General of Japan in Detroit is pleased to share with the public various resources about different aspects of Japanese culture. These are increasingly available in digital formats, accessible via the internet. For example, the print publication known as niponica is now also a web magazine, available in Web and PDF formats, in English, French, Spanish, Arabic, and several other languages.

Another example is <u>Japan Video Topics</u>, a collection of over 150

videos on dozens of topics about modern life in Japan and Japanese cultural traditions. Did you know that June 18th is International Sushi Day? Sushi (literally: "vinegared rice") is one of the most popular dishes in

June 18 is International Sushi Day

Japan, and is now also widely enjoyed around the world. Types of sushi include nigiri-zushi, in which slices of raw or cooked seafood and/or other toppings are placed on top of oblongs of seasoned, pressed rice (pictured below, top left). There is also *norimaki*, or sushi rolls, in which seafood, vegetables, and/or other toppings are rolled inside seasoned rice

wrapped in nori, or dried seaweed (pictured below, top right). Another type, called chirashi-zushi, features a variety of ingredients sitting on top of, or mixed into, a bed of seasoned rice (pictured at bottom). Details about other types of sushi may be found here.








