




Saginaw Japan Week Offers Cultural Exploration Virtually

October 22, 2020, marks the 30th anniversary of the official sisterstate relationship between the U.S. state of Ohio and the Japanese prefecture of Saitama, just north of Tokyo. This relationship originated when Saitama Governor Yawara Hata and a group of Saitama businessmen toured Honda of America's Ohio locations in September 1985.

After several exchange and goodwill visits, Saitama Gov. Hata and Ohio Gov. Richard Celeste signed an agreement making an official sister-state relationship between Ohio and Saitama on October 22, 1990. Japanese Farmers Transform Rice Fields

into Works of Art

October is a time of harvest, particularly in northern Japan, where the phenomenon of "*tambo* art" or "rice-paddy art" originated in recent years. In the spring, groups of farmers select designs and plant different varieties of rice to create colorful patterns and scenes, such as the one pictured above, as the rice matures. It has brought some towns and villages an increase in tourism, as travelers visit to see the *tambo* art for themselves.
