This annual competition is coordinated by the Consulate-General of Japan in Detroit with support from Delta Air Lines, the Japan Business Society of Detroit (JBSD), the Japanese Teachers Association of Michigan (JTAM), and the Japan America Society of Michigan and Southwestern Ontario (JASMSO).

Both high school and university students are invited to demonstrate their language ability through delivering original speeches entirely in Japanese. The students present to a panel of judges and the winners are chosen based on their performance and accuracy.
