

# Hinamatsuri Event at the Detroit Institute of



The Consulate General of Japan, Detroit Institute of Arts and Japan Cultural Development will join together to present Hinamatsuri, or Girls' Day Festival, on Sunday, March 4th at the DIA. The event will take place in the Rivera Court and the Great Hall from 11:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Admission is free and open to the public.

Girls' Day is a special day when families throughout Japan celebrate their daughters and pray for their good health and happiness. Homes are decorated with elaborate displays of hina dolls which represent an Imperial wedding in ancient Japan. A seven-tiered set of the dolls will be on display at the event.

Other displays and activities will include cultural demonstrations, such as tea ceremony, koto performances, and workshops for flower arranging and sweets making – all traditional arts of Japan. For this year's kimono presentations, two young girls (about 4' tall) for each demonstration will be selected from the audience to be dressed in kimono and practice kimono etiquette on stage. Amazing crafts by Japanese master artisans will also be available for purchase.

Please come and join the fun. Create your own flower arrangement or Japanese sweets to take home. See displays and watch the creation of Tinygami – origami pieces folded from paper squares as small as ½"! Observe the ancient art of preparing tea in an ultra-modern tea room.
