Her Imperial Highness Princess Akiko of Mikasa To Speak at DIA




Her Imperial Highness Princess Akiko of Mikasa will be visiting Michigan and giving a talk at the Detroit Institute of Arts as part of their day-long "Interconnections through Art and Culture: American Museums and the Building of US-Japan Relationships" event. Princess Akiko, who holds a doctorate from Oxford University, will speak about the positive impact of culture and the arts on U.S.-Japan relations past, present, and future.

The presentation will take place on June 12th at 10 A.M. inside the Detroit Film Theatre Auditorium. Prior to Her Imperial Highness' presentation, there will be a panel discussion moderated by Professor Tsutsui from the Center for Japanese Studies at the University of Michigan. Throughout the day there will also be demonstrations by visiting Japanese master artisans in the Great Hall, where two Japanese friendship dolls will be on display.
