Anne M. Hooghart, Ph.D. estimates she has taught more than 1500 students, from preschoolers to senior citizens, over the course of the past 30 years of her career as a teacher of Japanese language and culture. She fell in love with Japan during high school, when she spent a summer in Yokohama as a Youth for Understanding exchange student. She studied Japanese at the University of Michigan. After graduation, she took a position as an Assistant English Teacher on the JET Program.

Once returning back to Michigan, Dr. Hooghart started working at a Japanese manufacturing plant in Battle Creek. Soon, her employer had her teaching English to the Japanese ex-patriates and Japanese to the American associates there. On the side, she began serving as a private consultant about cross-cultural business practices and teaching introductory language courses at Western Michigan University, Kellogg Community College, and Lansing Community College.

Eventually, Battle Creek Lakeview High School hired Dr. Hooghart to build their Japanese program. She earned a Ph.D. in comparative education from Michigan State University, completing dissertation research fieldwork at schools in Shiga, and becoming a teacher educator, associate professor, and dean at Siena Heights University in Adrian. Since then, she has served as a Japanese-English translator, online instructor, and a member of the Consulate's public and cultural affairs section. Dr. Hooghart currently serves as an adjunct instructor of Japanese at Mott Community College in Flint, and as Educational Research Coordinator/Board Secretary at the Hinoki Foundation in Ypsilanti. "I will continue to study Japanese for the rest of my life," she observes. "And I will never get tired of teaching. I encourage everyone to do a job you love."
